That residents of Puerto Rico still lack basic provisions so long after Hurricane Maria is a shameful tragedy, not only in terms of inadequate preparation for this new era of recurring disaster, but also for demonstrating our lack of care for our non-state territories. Regardless of status, every citizen under the watch of the United States deserves equal protection, in terms of dollars and speed of response.

Now that fires, floods, and storms regularly rip through our cities, surprise is no longer a valid excuse. It's incumbent on us to take necessary precautions before the next major disaster. We must prepare reliable, consistent, and adequate funding ahead of the next disaster, so we're no longer forced to work with an ineffective and costly ad-hoc spending package, and make sure it is made available equally to every devastated state and territory. We should look to FEMA for guidance and utilize its National Preparedness System to work with states, municipalities, and private partners to explore local risks and solutions so that when disaster does strike, our citizens and infrastructure are prepared to brace the storm.

We should also look into reforming the Stafford Act and the National Flood Insurance Program, and build robust public-private partnerships in aid relief so that, in the event of another inadequate government response, disaster-ravaged citizens are not left to fend for themselves. But there must be a system in place to enforce accountability and transparency to avoid a repeat of the momentous failure of private contractors in post-Katrina New Orleans.

Corporate Rule

Big corporations and banks dominant our political process, spending billions to lobby for programs against the public interest, and to privatize public services for profit. This erodes the middle class, destroys vital services, increases poverty, and undermines our nation. Congress must work to return our government to the people, improve services, stand up to corporate lobbyists, and stop the privatization of public services. We need a constitutional amendment to establish that corporations are not people and that money does not equal speech.

Our campaign strategy has always been focused on taking our message directly to voters. Over the past six months we have spent the majority of our time fundraising and reaching out to local organizations and community groups. Several months ago we began our early voter contact efforts through bi weekly phone banks at several local colleges in the district. Now that we are coming in to the last two months before the primary, we are shifting our outreach efforts into high gear. We began canvassing last weekend, and will be doing so every weekend until the election. During our first weekend of canvassing we already knocked on over 3,000 doors. In May, we will begin canvassing during every weekday as well. Additionally, we have begun our online digital and print marketing campaign and have started to send out mailers.

- Your capacity to raise the necessary capital to fund the campaign,

I believe I have already displayed my capacity to raise the necessary capital for my campaign. My campaign has raised over \$1.2 million since I announced my candidacy. With over 5000 different donors, my campaign has raised the most money of any candidate in the 39th Congressional District.
